Donation Resources

You may already have a favorite place to take your excess clothing and household goods. If not, you can use the list below, or call the Thomas Jefferson Area United Way referral line at 972-1701. Clothing and Household Items

Salvation Army

Accepts donations of clothing and household items at 207 Ridge Street or 1820 Airport Road. Will pickup large items like furniture and appliances. Call 973-1398.

Goodwill Industries

Accepts donations of clothing and household items, but no large appliances, at 1242 Richmond Road. Drop-off only. Call 295-3967 for more information.

AMVETS

You can recognize this group by the pink bags it uses for donations. Provides pickup in certain zip-codes. Call 1-800-272-8387 to schedule.

Group Rummage Sales
